May 19, 2024 - Pentecost Sunday

Scripture: Acts 2:1-18
Reflection: "Happy Birthday, Church"

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Acts 2:1-2

On this Pentecost Sunday, we are joining Christians all around the world to celebrate the formation of the church when the Holy Spirit called people into community as Christ's body and blessed them with universal understanding of languages.

Some theologians describe Pentecost as the Church's birthday. Others describe it as a "big bang" that brought the Church into being, for just as God's Spirit came rushing into the world over the waters of creation, in the very beginning of Acts, God's Spirit rushes into the world to gather and transform God's people.

So where does that leave us? If we are willing to be amazed, Pentecost is one of the most awe-inspiring days in our Christian calendar. If we are willing to be transformed, it is an opportunity to be renewed in energy and faithfulness toward the work of God's kindom on earth when all people will experience true liberation and boundless love. So may we be willing to be amazed. May we be open to being transformed.

The boys are happily attending Waterloo Schools. The 15 year old attends Bunger Middle School in Evansdale and the younger one attends Lou Henry Elementary. Fortunately buses pick them up and drop them off in front of their apartment building.

Last Sunday the family attended the Queen of Peace Catholic Church Spanish service. It was a comfort for them to worship with many other Hispanic individuals. Once the mother recovers from some needed dental work, we will start pursuing job opportunities for her.
